



LAMBETH MUSIC SERVICE - END OF TERM UPDATE.

24th July 2020.

2020 has been a very unusual and challenging year!

Usually at this point of the year we would be celebrating music making in Lambeth with festivals and end of term concerts, hundreds of children would be taking their music exams, and many families and friends would have enjoyed watching some great live music at the Lambeth Country Show.

The summer term 2020 has concluded in a remarkably different way. We have had to postpone all of our scheduled summer events, our music centre has remained closed to students and our tutors have been teaching lessons via their front rooms instead of the classroom.

Thanks to the incredible support of families and schools and our staffs' willingness to work in new ways, we have successfully managed to deliver over 350 online music lessons every week and our teams of tutors have been busy replacing their ensemble lessons with pre-recorded videos of songs and creative music activities.

Our tutors have also been utilising their skills in a range of other ways including, administration, instrument repair, project planning and working on Lambeth-wide projects such as recording the backing track for the 'Song for Windrush' which you can find [here](#).

The partner organisations that help us to provide additional in-school and out-of-school activities have also continued to support 85-100% of the children and young people they work with through online learning and activities. We are pleased to announce that we have had an incredible response from over 85% of parents and carers eager for their children to return to their weekly lessons and we look forward to welcoming them back.
